Merrymeeting Audubon Field Trip - Shorebird Sunday

This morning at Wharton Point, six birders began to observe the shorebirds as they foraged on the incoming tide. However, the impending rain, which could be seen far out in the bay, made its way toward us from the southwest, soon overtaking our viewing position.

Even though today's Shorebird Sunday was postponed from yesterday morning's rainout (Shorebird Saturday), we did not fare much better this morning, with only about 40 minutes of rain-free viewing. Our bird count (which on a normal morning (without rain) at this location during August may total 40+) was a respectable 28 species.
